

Here is your new recreational fishing licence. The licence is personal and is also valid as an angling licence. Remember to take ID with you when you go fishing.

No validity period is printed on the licence. This means that the licence is valid as long as the fishing licence number remains valid. Validity is extended against renewed payment when the licence number expires, or is about to expire. You do this by logging into www.fisketegn.dk, (at the top left) with your fishing licence number as UserID, and your postcode or, where applicable, that which you have altered it to, as password.

If you have disclosed your email address, you will be sent an email two weeks before your licence must be renewed. If you have not disclosed your email address, you can do so via “edit information” and add to/edit the relevant fields.

Here is some general information about recreational fishing which can hopefully be of some benefit:

In seawater a recreational fisherman may use six tools at the most:

- Hook and lines with 100 hooks
- Nets
- Fish traps
- Fishing pods

NB: A maximum of three nets may be used at a time to a total maximum of 135 metres.

One of the tools may be a shrimp trap pole. Shrimp trap poles may only be put up after written application has been made to the local fisheries inspectorate. The application form can be found on the Danish AgriFish Agency's (NaturErhvervstyrelsen) website. Trap poles must comply with the rules which are defined in the Executive Order on recreational fishing in salt and fresh water and tackle fishing, etc. in fresh water.

In order to conserve eel stocks, limits have been introduced for this type of fishing. Among other things, the use of traps is forbidden between 10th May and 31st July.
